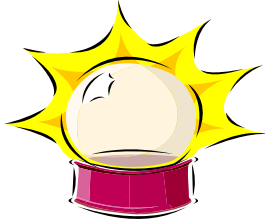


My Future Awaits!

- www.projectionscentral.com (projection of job availability by nation and state)

You need to apply and fast. College continues to get more competitive each year. You need to make your reservations early. Get an application from your counselor or apply on line at . Then, get your application into your counselor with the check. You can always decide to decline an offer of admission, but you may not always have the option to apply. Apply to a “ideal”, “real” and “back-up” school. Go take a campus visit, attend college/career fairs, and visit with college representatives in Bradford’s library. College may cost more than any single investment you make for the rest of your life. Spend time to decide.

- Make a campus visit to each college that you have applied to - it may help in making the final decision.
- Notify each campus about any schedule change you make from this point forward. The college has the right to rescind an acceptance offer due to class changes and/or grades earned.
- Search for scholarships! Money is out there.
- Complete the FAFSA form in January.
